INVISIBLE—Colossians 1:16, "For by him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and <u>invisible</u>, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him and for him".

Life under the sea can be nasty, brutish, and short if you don't have an effective form of camouflage. The cuttlefish's skin, for instance, holds some ten million color cells, allowing it to impersonate a chunk of a coral, a clump of algae, or a patch of sand. But for animals in the open ocean, there's no place to hide. For them, the best camouflage color is no color at all—transparent bodies allow them to partially blend into their watery surroundings. And now, a scientist has discovered that some of these animals possess yet another magician's trick—antireflective coatings that render them nearly invisible.

Laura Bagge, a marine biologist and doctoral student at Duke University said, "They are really hard to see when they are in the water. The only thing that gives them away is their eyes. The retina has to be pigmented; that's the way it collects light." Bagge is a specialist on invisible crustaceans—mostly notable, predators known as hyperiid amphipods. She discovered that some hyperiids enhanced their invisibility by making use of antireflective coatings. Some hyperiids' legs were covered by extremely tiny structures called nanoprotuberances, which look like shag carpet. The idea is that it basically dampens the reflections, softens the reflections in the same way that hanging carpet on a recording studio wall softens sound waves. God' creation is full of amazing things!

NATURE-INSPIRED WOUND GLUE—Researchers at MIT were searching for a better way to quickly seal wounds in critical lifesaving situations. They looked to an unusual place for inspiration—barnacles, the small sea creatures that attach firmly to rocks, ship hulls, and other wet, dirty surfaces. By mimicking the properties of the barnacles' sticky proteins, the MIT team created a bio-compatible glue that can adhere to human tissues even when covered in blood, forming a seal within 15 seconds. This is far faster than the several minutes it takes for sutures or patches with blood-clotting features to do the same.

Barnacles are a type of arthropod. Although they once were thought to be related to snails, it turns out they are actually related to crabs and lobsters. They

are exclusively marine and tend to live in shallow and tidal waters. Psalm 104:24,25, "O LORD, how manifold are thy works! In wisdom hast thou made them all: the earth is full of thy riches. So is this great and wide sea, wherein are things creeping innumerable, both small and great beasts." -RD
